Inspired by the film <u>Backyard Wilderness</u>, we are launching a series of **Backyard Wilderness Bioblitzes** in partnership with libraries, museums, science centers, and community hubs across North America.

Bioblitzes are short events in which people come together to explore nature and make and share observations of the plants and animals living all around them. These events are often held in local parks and open spaces.

Bioblitzes are gatherings of scientists, citizen scientists, land managers, and more, all working together to find and identify as many different species as possible. Bioblitzes not only help land managers build a species list and atlas for their park and provide invaluable data for researchers, they also highlight the incredible biodiversity found all around us.

Backyard Wilderness Bioblitzes are open to anyone and are family-friendly. **Backyard Wilderness Bioblitzes** are powered by the app and web platform, iNaturalist. Just bring your smartphone with the iNaturalist app or your digital camera, your curiosity, and your powers of observation to help catalog the natural wonders of our parks and open spaces-our 'backyards.'

- Participants will collect data that are important for better city planning, park management, conservation, and science.
- Participants will use the Seek app go on a treasure hunt to discover plants and animals around them.
- Participants will continue to make and share nature observations using the iNaturalist app and website.
